1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Rampur is a historical city known for its captivating grandeur. Here almost every crumbling wall has a story to narrate. The history of Rampur is endowed with an eventful past, a rich grand architectural legacy, palaces, markets and unmatched crafts. Most of the memorials, impregnable forts and pristine palaces are now housing the Government offices and colleges. Government Raza Post Graduate College was also housed in one such pristine palace on 16th July, 1949.

The **first Govt. Degree College of Uttar Pradesh**, Govt. Raza P.G. College, turned **75 in 2024.** Seventy four years, in the life of the college especially in a city like Rampur which speaks of its rich culture, heritage and glorious traditions in terms of epochs are the fleeting moments in the march of History. The college experienced seventy four years as it grew and moulded itself to face challenges and bewildering pace of change. Throughout these decades the college never remained static and these decades were rewarding too. It witnessed a long story of the phenomenal success and achievements. This college soared to the new heights of excellence and perfection not only in academics but in every sphere of activities like research, sports and extension activities. **Raza College is the first Government College in UP applying for fourth cycle of NAAC.** Indeed, all this is the outcome of pains taking and unstinting efforts made by a dedicated and sincere team of nation builders our teachers, employees and of course the disciplined force of our students.

To make the students self- dependent and to develop the qualities of leadership the unit of NCC, NSS and Rover Rangers are registered in the college. For distance Education IGNOU, Center is running successfully for the last fourteen years. The College has rich green environment so a green and clean campus. Now the college has ISO: 9001-2015 certification.

1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

Institutional Strength

The college has a good number of well-qualified staff, selected by the U.P. Public Service Commission Allahabad. At present 73 permanent faculty members are serving in our college in which 57 are Ph.D. There are 20 departments functioning including Science, Commerce, Arts and Education with Post Graduation Degree in 14 subjects. BBA retail is also introduced in this session. Six vocational Course are selected by College for UG students under NEP 2020 for skill and personality development of the students.

College has well defined vision and mission and follows the curriculum of affiliating university. Admission process (widely displayed) is quite transparent (online admission since 2016). Reservation is provided to different strata as per rules. Traditional method of teaching is being coupled with audio-visual system. Faculties are highly qualified and many teachers are recipients of awards. The faculty participated in 359 professional development programmes during last five years. Six research projects are being supervised, 197 research papers and a total of 244 books/chapters in books published in last 5 years. The college has organized more than 43 national seminars/workshops/FDP during last five years. The neighbouring communities are benefitted by the extension activities of the college.

The college has a vast area and ample space for further construction. The maintenance grant of college is optimally utilized. The college has adequate facility for sport and cultural activities. Library has 84068 books (many are rare collection).

The academic calendar is followed in due course. College honors to first three meritorious student, the athletics champion and captains of each sport team. There is a long list of cultural activities that are performed on different occasions. The adoption of biometric system and the installation of 72 CCTV cameras are additional features in the campus which enhance the managerial capability in the college. The college has the distinction in performing different acts for promoting the communal harmony and brotherhood in campus and neighbouring community. Raza College has almost 75% green Campus.

Institutional Weakness

Raza College is a **74 year old college**. The Library of the college, Physics, Geography, Mathematics Departments and Zoology Research Lab is located in a building built before 1905, so the college needs renovation and some new buildings. The number of classrooms in the college is not commensurate with the increasing number of students so more classrooms are required. The college library also needs to be upgraded to match research standards. The college requires hostel facilities, canteen and health care centre. Availability of big Gymnasium/Auditorium will definitely enhance the performance of students in sports/Cultural.

Inspite of having abundant space which can be utilized for further construction (i.e. classroom, multipurpose hall, auditorium, gymnasium, P.G. blocks) the college has not been able to procure grants for construction.

Teachers' posts are vacant in some departments and some departments are one faculty department which proves to be a constraint in creating a culture of learning, although we are doing well by collaborative actions. There is also a shortage of administrative and technical staff. Many posts of group IV class staff including sweeper is also vacant and being managed by daily wagers.

Having such competent faculty (78% Ph.D. teachers; 15 research centers) the college could have secured more research projects and more publication on the record and the linkages for active researching (with industries and international dignitaries) need to be strengthened. College needs to strengthen the mechanism to generate internal resources.

Institutional Opportunity

The college has vast amount of land at its disposal and bears potential to allow thriving (diversification/expansion) of courses offered. Financial support from the State will allow the college to achieve more success. There is growing demand for value added and job oriented courses. The college has adequately qualified staff, well-versed with ICT tools and LMS and proper financial support for ICT expansion will help for developing it into an incubation centre for innovations in teaching-learning.

College has recently established conference room equipped with A/V system and has establish a smart room with the help of RUSA grants, computer block with at least 60 additional PC/Laptops.

The college is recognized by the U.G.C. under the section 2f and 12 B, which gives the faculty a great opportunity to apply for projects and seminars which provide a great opportunity for the students. All of the P.G. Departments (15) have good publication and college has potential to develop itself as active research centre.

Different wings of NSS, RR and NCC have performed excellent task but establishment of linkage with industries and NGOs will provide more benefit to neighbouring communities.

As soon as the more grants are received the automation of library, strengthening of e-resource section, augmentation of computer section, establishment of virtual class room and LMS system is bound to take place. The statistical packages and operating application/software will also be installed. Aforesaid changes are bound to provide boost to ICT in teaching-learning system and will also strengthen the active researching in the campus.

Various MoUs have been signed with many organizations by virtue of which college can do wonders in different area. So college has infinite opportunities to flourish as an academic institution of higher education.

Institutional Challenge

The college has to formulate a long term plan for the expansion and diversification of courses being offered, and development of inter/multidisciplinary teaching and research.

Shortage of staff (teaching and non-teaching) is bound to create hindrance in college activities. The mechanism of continuous internal evaluation and implementation of CBCS system as per NEP 2020 will be fruitful if state government makes official provisions for the same.

Due to failure of university in conducting regular Ph.D. entrance test and research methodology workshop for so long, Ph.D. enrolment has greatly reduced but due to implementation of API system, the faculty members

are now bound to actively involve in researching.

The establishment of links with NGO/Industries for extension work and improved documentation of the same will provide better opportunity to the college in establishing its role in benefiting local communities.

The budget deficit involved in the maintenance of 74 year old College building. Thus, continuous persuasion on the matter may bring fruitful results.

Subjects like Sociology, Geography, Philosophy and Persian are presently devoid of the teacher. Likewise, non-teaching staff posts are also lying vacant (awaiting appointment at government level). Unavailability of any scheme for professional development of non-teaching staff is also an issue. Non-availability of funds for running career oriented programmes e.g. Remedial Coaching, Tutorials to slow and advance learners, career counseling and placement cells, is also a challenge.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

- GRPG College, Rampur, U.P. is a constituent college of MJPR University, Bareilly and follows the NEP-2020 syllabus effective in all the colleges affiliated to the university.
- There are 20 departments comprising the Faculty of Science, Commerce, Arts and Education with Post Graduation Degree in 14 departments. BBA Retail has also been started this year.
- Six Vocational courses namely Computer Application, Advertising, Office Management and Computer Application, Basics of Tally & its Applications, Research Survey and Digital Marketing has opted out for skill development.
- Food and Nutrition, First Aid and Health, Human Values and Environment Studies, Physical Education and Yoga, Analytic Ability and Digital Awareness and Communication skills and Personality Development, the six Compulsory Co-Curricular papers are the part of syllabus of all the UG classes for personality development.
- Seminars, Internal Evaluation Exams & tests for the performance evaluation are the common practices.
- Excursions, celebration of important days, extension and career counselling lectures also form an integral part of the academic calendar.
- Technology aids teaching learning opportunities, for evolving flexible curriculum catering to different levels of learners and for overall development of the students using ICT equipped smart class rooms, mobile technology and wifi. Classrooms are airy, well-lit naturally, equipped with Green/White Board and adequate furniture for aiding the teaching learning process.
- There is an interactive multi-purpose hall too, which is well equipped with high-tech podiums & Acoustic Sound System.
- The faculty serves on the MJPR University's eminent bodies such as Executive Council, BOS and sports committees/trials etc.
- The research facilities are also available in almost all the departments. Approximately 84,068 books are available for students and access to various e Journals sites which aids quality Research.
- There is a distance education centre IGNOU since 2007 in which 12 three Year UG Courses, 07 Six Months Certificate courses, 04 One Year PG Diploma and 05 Two Year P.G. Courses are offering.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

- Being a government Institution and an affiliated college of MJPR University, Bareilly, from admission to examination all the processes are regulated according to the directives of MJPR University and Govt. of U.P.
- All the PG and UG except B.Ed. admissions are totally merit based. University entrance exam is conducted for admission in B.Ed. and Ph.D.
- Out of 93 sanctioned post 73 faculty position is filled in which 58 are PhD, 04 are MPhil with NET and 11 are NET qualified.
- In the current session there are 32 teachers registered as Research Guide 55 research scholar are doing research.
- At the beginning of every session there is an orientation programme which gives an insight into the entire curriculum, facilities in the college, committees, staff introduction, rules and regulations etc.
- Every year academic calendar is prepared both at college and department level which helps the teachers and students in organising various curricular and co-curricular activities in a planned way.
- To identify the advanced and slow learners, teachers have personal interaction with students and analyse their previous result and classroom performance.
- The faculty members conduct group discussions, seminars, debates, exhibitions and demonstrations which help the students to get a clear understanding of the topic.
- Students are motivated to use internet, YouTube videos, WhatsApp, magazines and e-Journals to enhance their knowledge.
- The college administration, Admission and internal examination committees ensure that all the queries or problems related to admission and examinations are resolved with utmost transparency and immediate response.
- Student Satisfaction Survey and various feedbacks are collected and analysed
- In NEP-2020 evaluation of students are conducted 75% through University exam and 25% weightage in UG and 30% weightage in PG through internal assessment activities which are a combination of mid-term exams, class performance, performance in debates, seminars, essays, assignments etc

Research, Innovations and Extension

- The college research committee monitors and promotes research activities. 32 faculty members are guiding 55 PhD scholars registered under their supervision. Five student have been awarded doctorate degree and one PhD scholars have submitted their thesis. Faculty member are engaged not only in research activities but also undertake minor and major research projects from various funding agencies like UPDHE, UGC etc.
- The college has been conducting seminars, conferences and workshops for the benefit and promotion of research atmosphere engaging faculty to involve in paper presentation and publications.
- More than 197 research papers in Peer reviewed journal and a total of 244 research paper in seminar proceedings, Books and Book chapter have been published by the faculty of the college during the past 5 years.
- Many of the teachers have authored books to their credit. One faculty Dr Jahangir Ahmad Khan has been awarded two time by Urdu Academy, Lucknow, U.P. for his Books.

- Apart from academic excellence the college is also actively involved in extension and outreach program to help society by its service.

- The college NSS, Rover Rangers, NCC, Road Safety Club, Eco Magnetic Club and Electoral Literacy Club render social and community services. They sensitize the faculty and students on institutional and social responsibility through awareness programs, Cleanliness drive, blood donation camp, seminars on social issues like female foeticide, tree plantation, anti-plastic rally, health and hygiene, water conservation program.
- Linkages and MOU with a number of organizations have been signed to exchange new knowledge and technology and also serve academic and research purposes.

From Session 2021-22 University has adopted the NEP-2020 at UG level and from 2022-23 session at PG Level. • All the Student are registered on ABC • Our college is registered on ABACUS-UP, a state-level academic bank of credits named ABACUS-UP. • All faculty and students of college admitted under NEP-2020 till now have already registered on ABACUS-UP. 3. Skill development: • As The NEP-20 has given due importance to vocational education and capacity development and to boost the employability skills and vocational skills of the learners at all levels. • The main feature of NEP-2020 is the integration of Vocational Education Programmes into mainstream Higher Education. No.1969/Sattar-3-2021 dated 18-8-21). • Internship/ apprenticeship/OJT/Training/Hands-on training is a mandatory part of a skill course and it will be completed during vacation or before/ after college hours, so mainstream classes will not be affected. 60% of student's assessment is based on skill part and done by skill partner on the basis of Internship/ apprenticeship/ OJT/ Training. • All skill courses are individual/ progressive in nature, so a student can choose different skills in different semesters or can specialize in one single skill. • These courses emphasize the importance of apprenticeships and internships to provide hands-on experience and industry exposure to students. This approach allows learners to apply theoretical knowledge in the realworld. • Industry academia integration and skill development cell need to be established in all HEIs of UP (G.O.No.142/Sattar-3-2021-8(35)/2020TC1 dated 15-1-21).

for the students to learn and understand the culture and language of different states. • Ek Bharat Shreshth Bharat was celebrated from 14 June to 19 June 2020 to make aware students about rich heritage of Indian culture. • Amrit Mahotsav, Kaumi Ekta Week, Urdu Mushaira, Hindi Kavya Paath, Hindi Saptah, Sanskrit Shloka Recitation are organized to make students familiar with Indian Culture and traditions.

5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

• In the academic year 2021-22, the college adopted the NEP-2020. - During the field trips the students get chance to observe the natural habitats of animals and plants and heritage of Indian Culture and various geographical domains of our country.
- Apart from academic practices, students participate in co-curricular activities and get a chance of
 exposure to career counseling, guidance, placement tips and personality development addressed
 by faculty members and outside sources.
- Furthermore, students get a chance of exposure to different cultural activities organized by the college during the Youth Festival "Umang" and Annual Function. All such exposure helps in building the all-round development of students.
- Every year an effective feedback is taken. Students, parents, alumni, and teachers are the four quadrants that are used to measure the overall success of students.

2.3.1

Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences and teachers use ICT- enabled tools including online resources for effective teaching and learning process

Response:

- Experiential learning is an engaged learning process whereby students "learn by doing" and by reflecting on the experience. Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences.
- In Raza College Experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are mainly aimed to raise the academic standard of the students and to provide them exposure for their holistic development.
- Experimental mode of learning is frequently adopted by the students of Science (UG/PG), B.Ed. and certain arts subjects (Psychology, Geography, Pol Sc etc). It provides greater opportunity to engage themselves intellectually, creatively, emotionally and physically.
- At the start of every academic session there is an orientation program for new students, in which there is a special session on internal assessment.
- The faculty of college gets more time for interacting with students, for the sake of internal evaluation during the Practical sessions.
- Syllabus, question pattern and evaluation system is shared with the students by their respective subject teachers and mentors.
- The conduction of student seminars on a particular topic of their subject is also a robust exercise in evaluating the acumen. It is quite helpful in removing the "dais phobia" prevailing in the mind of the students and acts as their confidence booster.
- The faculty of college has developed the "in class questioning" as regular feature during and after the delivery of lectures. The students are very alert and sensitive during that time. They intend to analyze the answers given by the colleagues (degree of accuracy of answers) and tend to elaborate the answers. Accurate answers given by the teacher in the class is easily grasped by the students and is quite helpful in clearing the concepts about the topic and is helpful in developing their interest in the subject.
- As NEP 20 Internal exams are conducted offline and there is also a process of make-up exam for those students who have been absent in the internal/midterm exam.
- After the internal examinations are over, the students are shown their answer sheets in class so that they can evaluate their performance & if any correction/revaluation has to be done, they can discuss it with the concerned faculty.
- Students from the weaker section are hesitant in expressing themselves. When they are asked to come to the "dais" for speaking about a particular topic, they make comprehensive preparation of the subject and tend to analyze and elaborate the suitable means of presentation by using charts, power point presentation etc. In case of a non-satisfactory presentation the immediate guidance furnished by the teacher is quickly grasped by the entire class. Such internal evaluation exercises are helpful for the entire holistic development of the student.

- After the internal examinations are over, the students are shown their answer sheets in class so that they can evaluate their performance & if any correction/revaluation has to be done, they can discuss it with the concerned faculty.
- Internal exams cultivate the habit among the students to develop a tendency to exhibit their knowledge of the subject.
- The conduction of student seminars on a particular topic of their subject is also a robust exercise in evaluating the acumen.
- After the evaluation, further guidance by teachers inspires them to gather detailed and advanced knowledge about the subject.
- There is an internal/External examination committee which makes time table, rules, regulations and deal with exam related process. Committee coordinates with the university through letters and makes all necessary arrangements for the exam.
- Students are well informed of exam schedule, pattern, syllabus, mark/ credit division etc. through their mentor, subject teacher, notice board, WhatsApp groups & college website.
- To deal with internal examination there is an internal examination committee. Making all necessary arrangements like rules, exam dates, curriculum, pattern, mark distribution etc.
- Solving students' exam -related problems is a prime concern of each department and committee. Grievances redressal cell also resolve students' issues.
- Teachers gave special attention to slow learners in classes. For weaker students there are remedial classes to improve their skill & performance.
- Besides exams there are many other competitions held in college as part of extracurricular/ Cocurricular activities.
- University Exam related grievance remain negligible as there is no scope of any partiality/biased evaluation, as the examiner get bar coded copies for evaluation (no idea about a candidate or

exam center).

- If a student is not satisfied with the university assessment marks, he/she can submit a Challenge Form (with prescribed fee) for scrutiny of answer sheets. His/her answer book is evaluated second time and revised mark sheet is issued by the University.

MJPR University Authorities and the institutional administration under the supervision of Principal monitor the execution of Curriculum and evaluation. At college level, there are so many ways to evaluate the course outcomes of various subjects. As per NEP every subject internal exam are conducted and college Internal Examination Committee deals with the implementation of the evaluation reforms and identifying the areas of strength and weaknesses of the students through the results of internal assessment.

Each department conducts activities like Seminars, Practical work, assignments, Field Survey, Career Counselling Programmes etc. Departments also organize Personality Development Programmes such as various competitions at college level, Departmental competitions for adding values to students learning experiences. College organizes alumni meet to evaluate the progress of passed out students. Every year many students of different subjects qualify NET & JRF and some students also get gold medal in MJPR University's convocation for their brilliant performance.

Every year college publishes Annual Magazine to promote the creative writing and literary skills in the students in the form of writing Articles, Poems and Essays etc. for the college Magazine. Many programs are organized by Eco Magnetic Club, Electoral Club, Road Safety Club, NSS, NCC & Rover Rangers to develop community and social responsibilities and awareness.

The Course Outcomes, Program Outcome and Program Specific Outcomes of different subjects have been displayed on the website of the institution. The teacher concerned explains the outcome of every paper as well as general utility and practical application of their subject, with respect to the market value and job prospects. The outcome of every paper and entire subject are mainly measured by the score obtained by students in University exams. Students under low score (in spite of better potential) are advised to appear in the improvement examination. They offer further counselling and provided with more relevant literature. Increased knowledge and renewed interest, provoke the student to gather more knowledge and score better. The program outcome and Program Specific Outcomes of the subject are very much helpful to students while preparing for competitive exams and for hunting for a job or running their own business. The students are exposed to the utility of the POs and PSOs of subjects during the career counselling session organized by the Department or addressed by faculty of resource persons. After the completion of courses, students are further given placement tips. Unfortunately, many of the students are unable to communicate their placement to the institution, but many of them tend to retain the connection. The measurement of PSOs of the subjects is mainly done on the basis of success of students in getting the placement or setting up their own business on the basis of knowledge acquired by them on the subject.

Response:

- There are 28 well maintained and cleaned classrooms that have required furniture and facilities for the students for learning comfortably.
- A modern and well equipped multipurpose Seminar hall for organising various Seminars, cultural programmes etc. has enough lighting, well ventilated, digital podium, two LCD projectors and white screens. It has approximately 150 sitting capacity with size of 2231.91 sq feet.
- Seven departments, Zoology, Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Psychology and Geography are having their UG and PG laboratories which are properly maintained with required equipments for the practical learning of the students. These laboratories have enough space for accommodating the students in a proper way.
- All the seven Departments have a computer facility also.
- Being 74 years old institution every department of Raza College is equipped with the necessary instrumentation needed for different exercises listed in the curriculum.
- College has two computer labs.
- Moreover, all the 14 PG Departments (Zoology, Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Maths, Commerce, Hindi, English, Urdu, Psychology, Geography, Economics, History and Political Science) and BEd department are research centers and the faculty members of most of the departments are recognized supervisors. Hence, there is no dearth of instrumentation and literary facilities for conducting active research in cognate fields.
- Zoology department Research labs has acquired quite sophisticated instruments for working on Phthiraptera and Toxicology.
- Raza College has its own playground measuring 320 feet x120 feet. The aforesaid games field is bound by barbed wire from all the side.
- The sport room of the college comprises 3 chambers (measuring 16 x 19 feet, 10 x 19 feet and

26 x 10 feet). The last chamber is used as a store of sports equipment.

• All the necessary equipments for Athletics (Races, Hurdle race, Long jump, High jump half step jump, Ball throw, Discus throw, Shotputs – for boys and girls), outdoor games (Cricket, Football, Hockey, Basketball, Badminton) and indoor games (Table Tennis, Carom, Chess etc.) are

abundantly available in the sports room.

- The college has three Badminton court with one cemented Badminton court (measuring 20 x 44 feet) and one cemented Basketball court (measuring 94 x 50 feet).
- The college has soft court for Volleyball (measuring 296 x 59 feet).
- Raza College has developed a small gym with various equipments for teachers and students. The
 various equipment presents are Treadmill with digital monitor for measuring heart rate, calorie
 burn, different progressive program for endurance development. Exerbike: This is used for
 cycling, which develops our hamstring and quardiceps muscles. 4 stations multipurpose- to
 develop strength for pactrolis major, deltoid muscles etc. Stepper: This is for overall
 strengthening of the body mainly shoulder, hand, core, ligaments muscles. Dumb bell Mats for
 yoga
- The institution organises annual sports meet which is widely participated by students and staff. The winners of the events are felicitated in prize distribution ceremony.
- The college has adequate facilities for cultural activity. A cemented platform is available in the Central ground of the campus.
- Mushayara, Annual function(Alankaran Samaroh), Youth festival(Umang) programs are organized in in tentage built (at the time of the function) in front of the stage.

6.3 Faculty Empowerment Strategies

6.3.1

The institution has performance appraisal system, effective welfare measures for teaching and non-teaching staff and avenues for career development/progression

Response:

There is a very effective system for the appraisal of performance of staff.

- All the teachers is compulsorily to fill Annual Confidential Report (ACR) having a detailed account of all the activities performed during entire session in the month of April every year.
- The aforesaid ACR is firstly forwarded by the concerned head of the department and then evaluated by the Principal.
- On the basis of all round performance, the teacher is given Grade 3 (excellent), 2 (very good), 1 (good) or 0 (normal).
- The ACR graded by the Principal of the college is sent to the DHE, Allahabad.
- The ACR endorsed by the Director is communicated to the Secretary, Higher Education U.P.

- During Annual Promotion of teachers to the post of the Principal, last 10 years ACR grading is taken into consideration.
- The performance appraisal of non- teaching staff is also done through ACRs. The office superintendent is given appraisal of his work in a form while for the rest of the office staff, support staff appraisal is entered in their service book. Their performance appraisal is done by the Principal

The College is totally governed by Govt. of U.P. The several welfare schemes available for teaching and non-teaching staff as per the norms of the Govt. of UP are:

- Employee recruited before 2004 are entitled to life time pension while the staff appointed after April 2004, are covered under NPS.
- Gratuity is a defined retirement benefit plan upon leaving his job.
- Earn Leave encashment facility is there for EL not availed by an employee.
- In several medical illnesses, the teachers get benefit of **Medical** reimbursement as per Govt. rules.
- 180 days leaves are given to female employees for the Maternity/adoption of maximum two kids.
- Group insurance offer personal insurance. All the teachers and employees have to pay a fix amount of RS. 400 as a part of GIS.
- All employees are provided with HRA as per Govt. rules.
- 365 days medical leaves are given during whole period of service with full pay and two years without pay.
- In every academic session, 14 casual leaves are provided.
- A total of 730 days Child Care Leave are given to female employees for taking care of their children upto 18 years of age. More than 20 teachers availed this facility during the last five years.
- Housing loan is given by Govt. upto 7.5 lakhs against the construction of house.
- **Duty leaves** are granted for attending meetings, seminars, workshops and for other programs under faculty development programme.
- College employees can get a sanction of 75% of the amount deposited by them in their GPF account for constructing house/education of ward/marriage of the ward or during illness.
- In the event of an employee's death, the college offers a job to the deceased employee's qualified ward, following government rules.
- The university deducts 5% of employees' total remuneration for the Teacher Welfare Fund. This fund provides financial assistance to the wards of employees/teachers in cases of long illness, injury, or death.
- During transfer TA/DA and disturbance allowance is paid.
- Whenever an employee is sent to another place on duty, the college pays TA/DA as per rules.

6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1

Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/ nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

Response:

- The college is fully funded by the U.P. Govt. The budget is allotted by the Govt. as per the requirement and proposal sent by the college.
- The finance committee consisting of Principal, IQAC coordinator and senior teachers monitor the effective use of financial resources.
- After the receipt of funds the committee monitors its distribution and expenditure to ensure the optimal utilization of financial resources.
- Funds obtained from RUSA are monitored by RUSA committee and from UGC by UGC committee.
- All the financial documents are verified and the audited income/expenditure report and utilization certificate are sent to concerned agencies.
- The purchase committee of the college is responsible for all the norms and quality of items purchased in the college. All the quotations/tenders are opened in presence of at least 5 members. All the members sign on the "envelops" and the "quotations/tenders" mentioning "opened before us". The comparative table indicating the prices of different item quoted by vendors is further signed by members of the purchase committee. Lowest rate quoted by vendors is encircled by red ink. Likewise the bills of each firm are also signed by in charge of Deptment Before being presented for payment.
- The contracts of sale of fruits (mango, litchi etc.) from trees present in the college are given through auction. Likewise, contract of honey (from bee hives of trees) is also given.
- In the month of March, the Principal of the college, appoints a three member committee for each Department (one from the same department and two from another department) for Annual Verification of stock register.
- The committee verifies the entry of each item and its bill in the stock register the balance of check stock (both non-consumable and consumable) is also done. The verification committee writes its report on the last page of the register that "All the items purchased during the year have been

- entered in the stock book and the balance items are physically present". The aforesaid report is then countersigned by the Principal.
- Grants received and used by the college from other agencies (central/ state) are audited firstly by Chartered Accountant.
- Regional auditor of State Government (Moradabad office) conducts auditing of accounts every year.
- Audit team from the Directorate of Higher Education U.P. Visits occasionally to perform sample auditing.
- Audit party from auditor general (Central- Allahabad) visits the college regularly and conducts sample auditing.

7.1.1

Institution has initiated the Gender Audit and measures for the promotion of gender equity during the last five years.

Describe the gender equity & sensitization in curricular and co-curricular activities, facilities for women on campus etc., within 500 words

Response:

- It is very important to inculcate and enhance the values and norms of gender equity and sensitization among the students and teachers.
- Institution shows gender sensitivity in providing facilities regarding safety, security, counselling and common room facilities.
- Under the four phases of Mission Shakti, an ambitious scheme of the Uttar Pradesh government related to women, many programs have been organized in the college to make women aware.
- As per rules of U.P government, females are given 20% horizontal reservation in all the admissions (in every category i.e. SC/OBC/ General) as well as appointments in teaching and Non-teaching.
- The proctorial board of the college is working in the field of Discipline and order among students. Any problem or issue is solved under this board as per the norms. To ensure the anti-social elements cannot enter into college campus, a guard has been appointed. CCTV cameras have also been installed in different spots of the college for safety and security.
- 72 CCTV cameras and 24-hour campus security keep students and faculty safe.
- The college has female Proctor and a committee to tackle atrocities on women. Women cell deals with issue of safety, security and counselling of female students and staff.
- Gender sensitization programs are conducted every year from platforms of NSS/RR/Youth festival to create awareness about their rights and privileges in the work environment.
- Gender awareness is promoted at the College via International Women's Day, workshops, seminars, guest lectures, street plays, poster displays, counselling and other activities.
- The topic related to gender sensitization are sexual harassment and legal regulations are held to promote.
- Female students were taught "self defence."
- Regular human rights, domestic violence and cyber security education protects female students and employees.
- Counselling aims at helping the students in solving their academic, social and/or stress related issues. A special counselling group "**Disha**" has been formed by Psychology Department and many female students benefit from it. The committee is made up of at least one female representative from each department. The committee members are advising and assisting the student community with their problems.
- There is a separate room for girls (Girls common room) with open space covered with iron fencing equipped with fans and benches in its premises. The GCR is equipped with two toilets and a TT table. So, in spare time female students need not wander here and there in the campus.

The reading room of the library is also frequently used by females.

- The campus has separate washroom facilities for male and female students.
- Women Helpline nos. have also been published on wall magazine and notice boards of the college time to time.
- Women cell and IQAC has conducted gender audit.

7.2 Best Practices

7.2.1

Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual

Response:

- 1. Title of the practice: "Youth festival".
- 2.**Goals:** To identify and promote cultural talent among the students.
- 3. The Context: Many of the students have instinctive talent in various cultural fields. Due to heavy

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schedule of teaching and learning their talents in fields other than academic and sports remain suppressed and deserve exploitation. Keeping in view this aspect, the college organizes a three day function to allow the boys and girls to participate and express their talents in as many as 15 cultural activities. All the events of the function are widely publicized and entire programme is communicated to students in tabular manner. The victorious students are honoured by the college on closing day of function.

- 4.**The Practice:** The college organizes competitions on at least 15 activities i.e. group discussion, self, made poetry recital, extempore debate, slogan writing, cartoon making, Rangoli, mehandi, quiz (written), bouquet, fancy dress, solo singing, nukkad natak, story writing, essay writing and memoire writing. A committee of 2-3 teachers is framed for registering the participants of each activity. Students are are allowed to perform rehearsal in the presence of teachers. A committee of selected teachers is appointed as judges to evaluate the performance of participating students. After the completion of competitive event, the result of this event is communicated to apex community by the judge. On third day, closing event is organized in presence of chief guest. Cultural events are also organized to amuse the guests and students in big pandal erected for the purpose. The first three victorious students of each event are provided trophy and certificate by the chief guest.
- 5.**Evidence of Success:** Mass involvement of students as participants and spectators of events organized in youth festival is itself an evidence of success. As many as hundred students were awarded trophy by chief guest and special guest every year. Watching the glowing faces of students with trophies in their hands were too pleasing moments. Entire sequence of events which took and place during organization of cultural event and the prize distribution ceremony has been snapped by the photographer
- 6.**Problems Encountered and Resources Required:** Internal resources were mobilized for the purpose. The responsibility for setting the pandal, stage decoration and trophy distribution was given to separate committee, specially trained for the purpose. Nearly Rs. one lakh was spent on the event. All the students who participated or witnessed the closing function were offered lunch packets by the college. No problems were encountered in organizing the event.

In the fear-free environment of Raza College, apart from academics, students also actively participate in co-curricular and extension activities.

- The leadership within various college committees is predominantly comprised of women professors, with roles ranging from maintaining discipline to overseeing admission committees and cultural events. Notably, Prof (Dr) Seema Teotia heads the admission committee and IQAC, Dr Jagriti Madan leads law and order, Prof (Dr) Meenakshi Gupta leads Women Cell and Dr. Ajita Rani leads Disha- Counselling and mentoring Cell respectively.
- Under the directive of the U.P. government, Mission Shakti programs focus on ensuring 'Nari Suraksha, Samman and Swawlamban'. Girl's safety oaths are taken during programs and experts are invited to educate students on personal hygiene and government schemes for women. The college actively promotes gender equality by organizing dialogues between female students and role models from various fields. Health camps, counseling sessions and programs like "Chuppi todo, Khulkar bolo" encourage girls to register complaints against misbehavior.
- The college also undertakes several initiatives to sensitize students to gender equity, energy conservation measures, inclusiveness, human values etc. Keeping all these in view, the college organizes several programmes such as lectures, popular talks, workshops, **Seminars**, sports competition, activities under Rover Ranger, NSS and NCC units, **self-defense training**, workshops on women's rights and involving them in cultural and sports activities.
- Guest lecture by World Renounced, BARC Scientist **Padam Shree Sharad P Kale** is the notable event of the year
- Participation in social activities enhances the development of social knowledge and consciousness; and Educational institutions promote moral ideals and ethical standards. The college focuses on qualitative student performance and overall personality development.
- The Youth Festival "Umang" showcases hidden talents through competitions in **Mahendi**, **Rangoli**, **Singing**, **Role play**, **debate**, **Nukkad** and many more for addressing social issues.

The college has organized various programs such as Corona Awareness, Clean Campus Green Campus, Voter awareness and Road safety awareness to serve society.
